

Slide Guide

Tips to make sure your slide works well on TV

- Please use Widescreen Format (16:9 Ratio)
- Do not use clip art or word art
- No Gradients
- No Busy Backgrounds (No Textures, Detailed Pictures, Patterns)
- Make sure text is at least 24pt and a readable color, shade, and font
- Keep all text inside the "Title Safe" area. (This is just like the margins when you print a document)
- Stay away from overelaborate and complicated fonts
- Try not to use overly saturated colors like bright yellow, red, green, or blue, they bleed when on TV
- Only use up to two fonts
- Include your Logo and relevant Graphics and contact info on **EACH** slide (A picture is worth a thousand words!)
- Some things are hard to read on a small screen. If your slide is readable at 20% its usual size it should work.
